

Reports from December 10th, 2025, Regular Council Meeting

Utilities

Foreman Desrosiers reported that:

- There was a water main break on Mather Avenue this week. The line was replaced and a new curb stop was installed.
- Concrete has been poured and the contractor has started welding for the water treatment plant conversion project.

CAO Montgomerie reported that the new water meters and sensors have arrived and SaskTel will install the required tower in the next few weeks.

Fire Department and First Responders

Councillor Heck reported that he plans to attend the January 6th, 2026 Asquith Fire Department meeting and plans to attend one meeting per month thereafter.

Streets and Town Property

Foreman Desrosiers reported that the new Christmas lights have been installed.

Councillor Stack reported that the photo sensor on the mural beside the Elk's Hall needs to be replaced so the lights will turn off in the daytime.

Councillor Wolfe suggested that:

- a new outdoor rink be built where the old curling rink was located.
- the lot the current rink is on could then be used for commercial development.
- that the new rink be larger than the current one, and
- the Elks be honoured for their contribution to the current rink in some manner.

Finance

Administrator Montgomerie requested authorization to pay accounts that require payment at year-end prior to the January Council Meeting.

Waste Disposal

Rink, Cemetery, Sportsgrounds

Administrator Montgomerie reported that Still Standing Construction should be finished their portion of the renovations at the rink next week.

Recreation Committee

Mayor Stobbe reported that:

- the committee voted to allocate funds received from the R.M. of Vanscoy to repairs of the outdoor and indoor rinks. Each rink will receive 50% of \$3,166.67,
- Jeff Kielo has replaced Todd Summach as the representative from the R.M. of Vanscoy on the committee, and
- that the R.M. of Vanscoy has a grant program that matches funds used to purchase capital assets.

Administrator Montgomerie reported that the final portion of the Sask Lotteries grant will be received by the committee after Pike Lake returns a portion of the grant to Sask Lotteries and that those funds will be returned at Pike Lake's next meeting.

Town Personnel

CAO Montgomerie reported that Office Assistant Nicole's last day of work could be tomorrow, December 11th. However, she may be available to work longer pending sale of her house.

Policing

Councillor Heck stated that he will look into the RCMP Camera Registry and report his findings.
